Through cooking classes, grocery shopping trips, and opportunities to prepare meals with staff, for themselves, and their peers, youth gain valuable life skills. Many of our youth find connection, solace, and a sense of control in cooking and baking, using these activities as effective coping mechanisms that offer comfort and stability amidst their healing journeys.

Thanks to the support from Albertsons, the San Marcos Community Foundation, and the Hervey Family Fund, Casa de Amparo continues to provide a nurturing environment where foster youth can thrive and develop essential life skills. This support is crucial in helping them heal and build a brighter future.
